Rounding out the series is *Irma la Douce*, showing Thursday, November 18th. This comedy is about a Parisian policeman who becomes the lover (and unwilling pimp) of a carefree street-walker. After falling in love with her, the officer conspires to limit her occupation by taking on an alter-ego, "Lord X", to serve as her sole client.

For those who purchase season tickets, doors open at 10:30am with a magnificent luncheon served at 11:30am and the movie to follow.
