Runtime: 113 minutes. Rated R for language and brief sexuality.

And When Did You Last See Your Father, showing on **December 14th**, is a film based on the award-winning novel by Blake Morrison, telling the tale of a father, a son, and the family journey that takes a lifetime to unfold. Terminally ill and nearing death, Arthur Morrison struggles to reconnect with his son as they both overcome years of memories, tender and troubling. On his journey to acceptance, Blake (Colin Firth) learns about life, love, and the threat of losing it all. Runtime: 92 minutes. Rated PG-13 for sexual content, thematic material, and brief strong language.

On **December 21st**, take the chilling, thrilling journey of ***Encounters At The End Of The World***, as director Werner Herzog unveils the strange and beautiful wonders of Antarctica. Following the lives of the unusual men and women who risk their lives for science in the white wilderness, this film is informative, invigorating, and more than a little eccentric. Watch a survival guide battling white-out conditions with a cartoon-face bucket over his head, or a researcher contorting her body into a luggage bag... all in the name of science! Runtime: 99 minutes. Rate G.

I Served The King Of England, showing **December 28th**, harkens back to the traditions of silent film, vaudeville, and slapstick, as Director Jiri Menzel tells the story of Jan Dite, an ordinary Czech citizen caught up in a very unordinary stream of events. After 15 years of imprisonment by the Communist regime, Jan is left only to reflect upon his dreams of being a millionaire from a home in the dilapidated border town where he is forced to live. Rated R for sexual content and nudity.
