Thoroughly Modern Millie (1967), showing October 20, is a musical film starring Julie Andrews, Mary Tyler Moore, and Carol Channing. Set in New York City during the early 1920s, Millie Dillmount traded in her old-fashioned lifestyle for a new modern sensibility, and wardrobe to match. Millie's ambition is to find work as a stenographer to a wealthy businessman, and then marry him. Just as she thinks she finds the right employer, Millie develops a mutual attraction for another man, Jimmy Smith. The plot is further thickened by the mysterious disappearance of Millie's friend, Miss Dorothy. Millie teams up with chisel-jawed Trevor, and happy-go-lucky Jimmy to discover what really happened to Miss Dorothy.

The **2011 AT&T Fare & Feature Classic Film Series** concludes with ***Magnificent Obsession (1951)***, which will be shown November 17. When spoiled rich man, Bob Merrick, foolishly wrecks his speedboat, the rescue team resuscitates him with equipment that's therefore unavailable to aid a local hero, Dr. Wayne Phillips. Phillips selflessly helped many people in secret, and when Merrick learns of this, he clumsily tries to do the same.
